Northampton Youth Forum Memorandum of Understanding

Scope: This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is between West Northamptonshire Council, Northampton Secondary Schools or local youth organisations, Parents and the Young People representing the Youth Forum.

It is understood that the Youth Forum will be elected, by their School or Youth Organisation. The MoU sets out responsibilities, frequency of meetings, support and management arrangements and principles, and purposes of the agreement for the Forum.

Principles and Purposes: The MoU has the key principle of creating an understandable and clear agreement on operational arrangements for the Youth Forum. The MoU will establish an open communication channel between young people, the Council, other statutory organisations and community and voluntary organisations, representing and supporting young people.

The purposes of the Youth Forum:

- 1. Ensure that all young people in Northampton have a voice
- 2. Young people are not just representing themselves but providing a voice for young people's thoughts on issues locally
- 3. To engage young people (aged 13-19 yrs) in a consultative process that empowers them to share their views, interests and needs with each other so that their collective voice will inform Service Providers, and contribute to the decision making process in relation to service planning and the deployment of identified resources
- 4. Ensure political leaders and officers engage proactively with young people via consultation and engagement
- 5. To promote equality for young people
- 6. To stimulate and improve communication between WNC, young people and other organisations in the West Northants
- 7. To act on issues that are, important to young people accessing our services and in the local community
- 8. To feed back information from meetings and projects to their school and peers, and promote public youth forum events

Frequency of meetings

Youth Forum meetings will be held during school holidays, usually on a Thursday between 10am and 3pm. Where meetings fall in term-time they will be shorter meetings after school for no more than two hours. The Covid pandemic has also introduced the use of virtual meetings where necessary.

There will also be other meetings or activities to attend throughout the year. The forum dates will be circulated via email.

There is an expectation that members attend as many meetings as possible and send apologies if unable to attend. If two consecutive meetings are missed, a valid reason will be requested.

Staff Support

This involves ensuring the youth forum is influential within the Council and that their voices are heard and acted upon. An officer from West Northamptonshire Council will be present at each meeting. They will help co-ordinate, guide and support the young group by giving them confidence to make positive contribution to the meetings.

It is the role of the staff to promote the forum across West Northants, while acting as an advocate for the forum and establish links with other youth and community programmes. All officers will have DBS clearance.

Chair and other Responsibilities

The aim is for the group to be run by the youth members with staff present for support. The members will take on responsibilities such as chairing the meeting with an internal election to choose these positions to be filled. Elections will take place annually.

Areas of work:

The Youth Forum will develop a 12 month rolling action plan, focusing on issues that matter most to young people.

Refreshments

Tea, coffee and cold drinks will be provided at each meeting. There will be an expectation for youth forum members to bring lunch with them, or money to purchase lunch. However, if there is a difficulty with these, please get in touch with us to discuss alternative arrangements. No refreshments can be provided for virtual meetings.

Travel

There will be an expectation that youth forum members arrange suitable travel arrangements to and from face to face meetings and forum led events. However, if there is a difficulty in arranging travel to and from meetings, please get in touch with us to discuss alternative arrangements.

Review: This document will be reviewed annually, along with the action plan.

Youth Forum

Minutes of a meeting of the Youth Forum held at The Guildhall, Northampton, NN1 1DE on Wednesday 12 July 2023 at 4.30 pm.

1. Welcomes, Introductions and Apologies

Attended: Haroon (NSB), Lilybo (GA) Skye (NA), Tracy (NSG), Kamron (BC), Lola (NSG), Kyla (NIA). Adults – Morcea Walker, Jamie Wells, Aimee Luck.

Jamie welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced our guests from Ngage/Aquarius, Resolv, Northampton Integrated Sexual Health and Public Health.

4. Sexual health and sanitary products within schools

NISH and Public Health gave an overview of their services.

Corinna explained that NISH target 6th form students but don't work with younger years. NISH can provide assemblies and sessions around contraception, infection and also discuss topics such as consent, LGBTQ relationships, pornography, as well as offering STI testing and strive to normalise testing. For younger years school nurses in offer sexual health support in the school setting.

Previously School Nurses delivered class activity and assemblies which kept consistency. This has reduced since covid and whilst some schools still have school nurse input, many rely on teachers. Forum agreed they would prefer to have Sex Ed delivered by external person rather than a teacher they see all the time – much easier to discuss openly.

Philippa (Public Health) advised a task and finish group will be running to discuss an approach to commissioning and delivering sex education in schools. The group will involve health, education and council and would like to have young people's experiences and views included.

Sanitary products:

- Products are ordered through government portal by individual schools

- Schools take different approaches and there are often barriers to accessing products.
- On the flip side, some schools remove barriers and products are misused and wasted by younger years.
- Boxes are often emptied by one or two people at the start of a week and then there are no products need a way to notify for refilling.
- Forum agreed there needs to be some education around period poverty for younger years that may not understand yet.
- Need to promote more sustainable sanitary options too such as <u>mooncups</u> which are available free through schools!

Actions:

- Philippa to link Natasha in with Jamie/Aimee re task group
- Philippa to share resources and information for forum
- Agenda item for August to produce a guide poster for school toilets about period poverty and sanitary products and promote reusable items.

5. Substance Abuse-IYD Social media take over

Ngage/Aquarius are a youth service for 10-18 yrs tackling drug and alcohol problems and offering confidential advice and support on a one to one basis, in school or in the community. Outreach workers engage with young people out in the community that might be harder to reach.

They also deliver education and training to schools and teaching staff and offer free drug testing. If you want support you can self refer via their website.

Joy explained that Resolv are based in Stafford but she works across Northamptonshire. They provide education and training and are working with Yr 6 a lot at this time of year during transition to secondary school.

The focus is on aerosol misuse. These products are perfectly safe when used properly but are DEADLY when misused. Currently trying to deliver some NOS workshops with Jamie in secondary schools to raise awareness and provide education but difficulty has been transport so looking to go into schools instead. Since March 2023 NOS cannisters are now classed as an illegal drug. Support is usually provided by phone or via Zoom.

Forum asked about drink spiking (tests and support). Not something Ngage do but Aimee/Jamie can provide bottle spikeys and straws for young people going out drinking.

Discussed spiking test strips and a nail polish for testing drinks.

Kamron suggested either service could attend or support a workshop at the Youth Summit. If Youth Forum deliver a workshop on this topic could do this in partnership. Forum discussed Vaping as a priority issue among young people. Most have never smoked but use vapes as a fashion choice. Mixed views on how informed young people are; some know the risk but don't care, others not informed at all.

Agreed to create some key messages to share during the Youth Takeover Day on 12 August:

- **How addictive they are** – one bar + equivalent of 20 cigarettes

- Environmental impact and social responsibility.
- Encourage proper disposal and reduce littering.
- The ugly side of vapes ethical impact/lithium batteries
- Encourage a culture shift counter fashion statement (similar/link to sustainable fashion movement). Utilise influencers or upcoming performers at R&D for backing campaign.
- **Parent targeted messaging** modelling behaviour, leaving vapes around that children can take.
- Financial costs of addiction

Actions:

- Emma to share Ngage/Aquarius information for the forum
- Aimee/Jamie to bring bottle spikeys and straws to next meeting.
- Joy to share information on Resolv services for the forum
- Jamie to discuss campaign messages with Public Health colleagues
- Jamie to share themes to Comms team to produce some content ideas
- Forum members to create a graphic to put forward for the takeover day (all good with canva! use Instagram stories or post template)

Jamie asked for feedback from forum for the services about how they can best engage with students through class talks and assemblies:

- Activities (especially towards the end of the day)
- Interactive elements
- Be unique/stand out to get the attention and be memorable. No death by PowerPoint or video played.
- Vape amnesty in the session
- Have someone who has experienced and came out the other side.
- Mixed view on Class or assembly?
- Raised issue around specialist terms and complicated language which is an issue for those with English as a second language. Are resources available in other languages? Use of Al more available (click on flag in corner to change language on website). Services rely on teachers advising what the need is and type of students.
